# Is Your Child's Car Seat Safe?

## Car Seat Checkup Services

Safe Kids Mat-Su coordinates with community partners to provide a car seat "Checkup" service. Through this FREE service, parents and caregivers receive personal assistance from nationally certified child passenger safety technicians.

During a Car Seat Checkup, technicians:

- Ensure that the car seat brought in by the family has not been recalled
- Provide hands on instruction and demonstration on how to correctly place a child in a child safety seat
- Guide parents and caregivers with the installation of their child's car seat in the vehicle
- Offer tips on how to choose an age, height and weight appropriate child safety seat
- Help care providers and parents understand Best Practice
- Review the American Academy of Pediatrics recommendation that children be rear facing as long as possible, at least until 2 years old, and in the back seat until age 13
